

HAPPY GRANDPARENTS DAY!

September 13, 2009 is Grandparents Day, a great day to think about how much your grandparents mean to you. Describe how you feel about one of your grandparents, or someone else who is special to you, in a diamond poem.

A diamond poem starts with a description of one thing, then switches to a description of something else. It's easy to write one — just follow the directions under each line. When you're done, you can read it starting from the top or the bottom.

[the name you call your grandparent]
[two adjectives about your grandparent — words that describe him or her]
[three <i>verbs</i> about your grandparent that end in –ing — things they like to do]
four <i>nouns</i> that go along with you <i>and</i> your grandparent — things you both like, or have in common]
[three <i>verbs</i> about you that end in – <i>ing</i>]
[two <i>adjectives</i> about you]
[your name]

On the back of this paper, or on a separate piece of paper, draw a picture of you and your grandparent (or grandparents) together, doing one of the things you included in your diamond poem.
