- 3. \_\_\_\_\_ This person was one of the first people killed in the cause of American independence.
- 4. \_\_\_\_\_ This civil rights advocate told her life story in the book A Colored Woman in a White World.
- 5. \_\_\_\_\_ This person -- the 15th of 17 children born of former slaves -- grew up to become a college president.
- 6. \_\_\_\_\_ This person, the child of ex-slaves, developed a hair product and died a millionaire.
- 7. \_\_\_\_\_ Many consider this fur and grain trader to be the founder of the city of Chicago.
- 8. \_\_\_\_\_ This former coal mine worker born to former slaves got a degree from Harvard University and started what is called today "Black History Month."
