
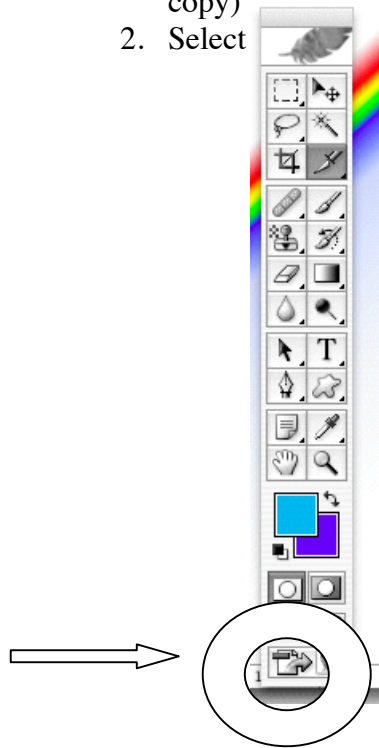


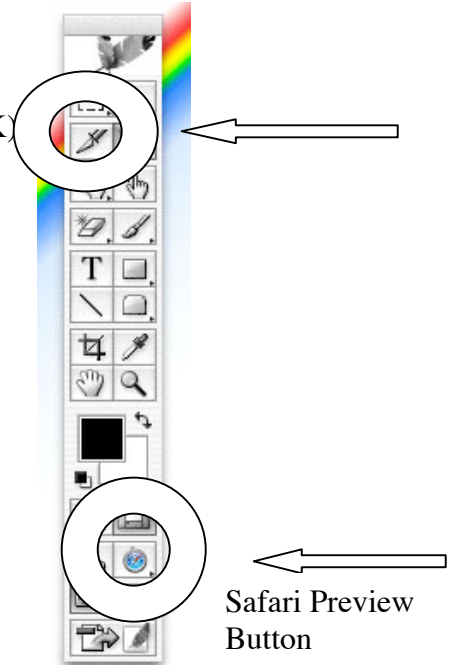
Photoshop >ImageReady>The Web

Open your Gonzo Server Space-Leave open on your desktop

1. Open your Photoshop Document – be sure to put one copy into my server space before proceeding (this will be a backup copy if something should happen to your copy)
2. Select  the jump to ImageReady button.

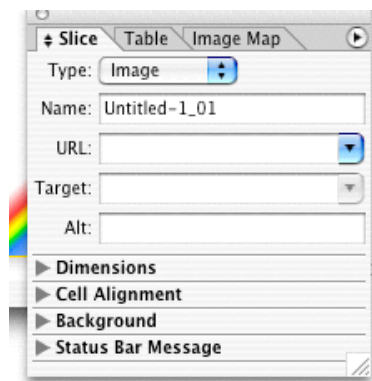


3. Then select the Select Slice Tool (K)



4. Drag a box around the word that you want to turn into an active link.

The following box will appear. Change the name to indicate the link. For instance, history, uses, etc



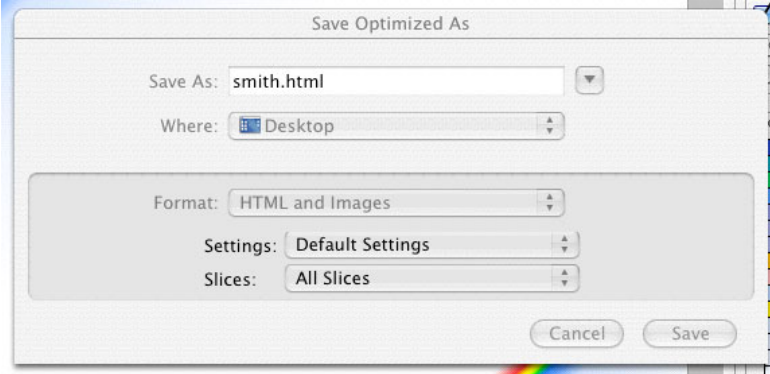

That is all you need to fill in.

5. Then select the Safari icon which is just above the and see how your page will look on the web.

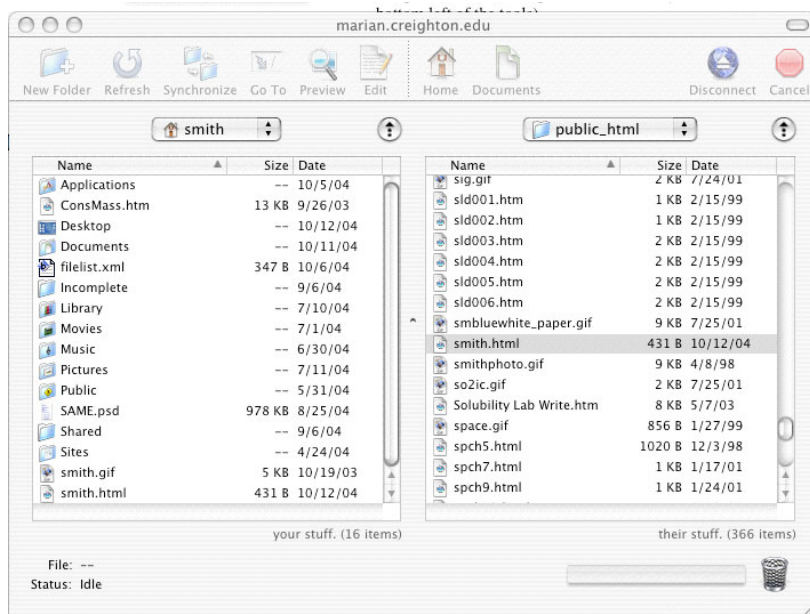
6. Jump back to PhotoShop (button at the very bottom left of the tools) Where ImageReady button was

7. Select File>Save for Web>Under the optimized tab then select SAVE. When you are saving it be sure to select HTML and IMAGES under the Format options



Be sure the file is being directed to your server space.

8. Open up **Transmit** on your hard drive. Make sure that public.html is showing above the second column.



9. From your Gonzo server space – drag the **element.html** file and **images folder** into the public.html side of the Transmit screen.

10. Go to **Terminal>Telnet** and do a **web ready**

10. Check to see if your pages work

11. Every time you make a new page using Photoshop/ImageReady you will need to open the newest image folder that ImageReady creates (should be in your Gonzo Server space-maybe desktop) – and drag those images into your Image folder in your public_html.
