- Did you know that the <u>Amazon rainforest</u> produces more than 20 percent of the world's oxygen supply? The rainforest's Amazon River contains more water than the next eight largest rivers in the world combined.
- Antarctica is the only land on our planet that is not owned by any country. Its ice represents 70 percent of all the fresh water in the world.
- 3. <u>Canada</u> has more lakes than the rest of the world combined. Did you know that the word *Canada* is an Indian word meaning "Big Village"?
- 4. **Damascus, Syria**, is the oldest continuously inhabited city in existence.
- 5. Istanbul, Turkey, is the only city in the world located on two continents.
- In the 1930's jazz musicians traveled from city to city. They used the slang expression "apple" for any town or city. Therefore, <u>New York City, New York</u>, became "The Big Apple."
- 7. The smallest island that is a country is **<u>Pitcairn Island</u>**. It is less than 2 square miles in size.
- 8. The first city to reach a population of 1 million people was **Rome, Italy**. It reached that size in the year in 133 B.C.
- 9. Parts of the **Sahara Desert** might not receive a drop of rain for ten years.
- 10. The world's highest waterfall, Angel Falls in **Venezuela**, is 15 times higher than Niagara Falls.
