## Read with Your Fingers

Most people read by using their eyes. However, people who can't see can still read. They read with their fingertips! The Braille alphabet is based on a rectangle of six dots. Each dot position has a number, 1 through 6 . For each letter, some dots are raised and some are not. For example, the letter A has one raised dot in position 1. The letter $G$ has four raised dots in positions $1,2,4$, and 5 . Use the Braille alphabet below to write messages to your friends in the empty box.
