You have until	to	spend	it	all!	1
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- **1.** You may buy **anything** you wish but only **one** of the same type of item. You therefore cannot buy two houses, two family cars, or two boats etc.,
- **2.** You must document all items by showing an ad or a **photo** from a catalogue or a newspaper. You are not allowed to spend over \$250,000 on any item. This includes the expensive purchases.
- **3.** You must **spend all** the money, without going over, and within \$10 of \$1,000,000.
- **4. Relatives** and **friends** are not allowed to sell you items unless you have an actual ad from newspapers, catalogues, etc. **Handwritten** adds do not count.
- **5.** Ads must include the **actual price** and **cannot** be **handwritten** in next to the item. Also, written estimates from business are required for any over the phone purchases such as boats, education, or braces.
- **6.** The finished project, including all the work, must be presented in a **folder** (see teacher about it). This folder should be **spotless**, **neat** and without any kind of damage.
- **7.** All purchased items should be **numbered** next to each picture or add.
- **8.** A master **table** is required at the **beginning** of the folder which is to be set up like the example below. Organize other pages similarly.
