

Make Mine a Combo

Some things go together like a hamburger and fries or peanut butter and jelly. Some sentences go together, too.

To combine two sentences, check to see if the sentences have the same predicate. Sentences that have the same predicate can be joined together with the word *and*.

Brett ran the race. Sadie ran the race.

Brett **and** Sadie ran the race.

Read the sentences. Use the word *and* to help you combine the sentences to create a new sentence.

1. Cows eat hay. Horses eat hay.

2. The ducks swim. The geese swim.

3. Teachers read books. Students read books.

4. Some of the pigs sleep. Some of the piglets sleep.

5. Sheep graze. Goats graze.
