The First Settlers

When Columbus found the Americas in 1492, there were settlers already present. These early settlers were called Indians because Columbus mistakenly thought he had landed in India, the land he was trying to reach. Actually, these Indians were made up of many different tribes with many different names, beliefs, and traditions. How these Indians lived was, in many ways, a result of where they lived. For example, the Plains lived in tepees so they could easily move while hunting buffalo. The Cherokee Indians adopted a more settled environment and tried to fit in with the white settlers.
